Wavecare has been providing mental health and wellbeing support to people living in or connected to the City of Monash for over 45 years, helping those in need of assistance due to illness, grief & loss, abuse, anxiety, depression, trauma, homelessness, crisis, misfortune, disability, relationship issues and isolation.

The skilled practitioners at Wavecare Counselling Services have professional qualifications and training, and several years of experience in providing clinical and therapeutic interventions appropriate to meet the needs of our diverse clients. Some of our specialist interventions include Cognitive Behavioural Therapy, Family and Systems Therapy, Acceptance and Commitment Therapy, Mindfulness Based Cognitive Behavioural Therapy, Play Therapy and Dialectical Behaviour Therapy.

As a not-for-profit community-based organisation, we work with clients across their entire life-span, offering inclusive care to people from diverse cultural and linguistic backgrounds, as well as people who identify as LGBTIQ+.

Our service offerings have expanded as we have grown, demonstrating our ability to respond to identified community needs. We now offer information and education sessions to various interest groups on a variety of topics affecting their lives, and offer social connectedness for our elderly community members who live at home through our popular Glencare Program. We are always on the lookout for areas where we can support our community better.

Wavecare Counselling has been an invaluable resource for the local community, providing much needed emotional support and mental health services to individuals of all ages. Through our compassionate and professional approach, Wavecare has helped countless people navigate life's challenges, from anxiety and depression to relationship issues and personal growth. Their ability to create a safe, non-judgmental environment has allowed clients to open up and explore their emotions, and develop the coping strategies needed to improve their mental health and well-being.

One of the standout aspects of Wavecare Counselling is our commitment to accessibility. By offering affordable and flexible services, we have made it possible for people from diverse backgrounds to receive the help they need, regardless of their financial situation.

Our Tuning in to Teens programme has been very successful. It is a valuable resource for parents and caregivers aiming to strengthen their relationships with teenagers. One of the primary reasons for its success is its focus on emotional intelligence. This teaches parents how to better understand, respond to, and guide their teens' emotional experiences, helping to foster a deeper connection. We have run courses in both English and Mandarin. They also help parents share their experiences and feel less isolated in their relationships with their teenagers. Nearly all psychologists at Wavecare have been trained to run this course.

We continue to hold free mindfulness sessions every week. Mindfulness involves being fully present and engaged in the current moment, without judgment. By practicing mindfulness, individuals can develop a greater awareness of their thoughts, emotions, and sensations, which can lead to improved overall mental health and a deeper sense of inner calm.

Meet Freud, our therapy dog. Therapy dogs play a crucial role in creating a safe, comforting, and supportive space for people, enhancing the effectiveness of therapy and making it a more positive experience. Freud is part of our team and belongs to our psychologist, Poly.



We are incredibly grateful to Community Bank Pinewood for sponsoring his training. Each week, Freud engages with clients, greeting them in the reception area and participating in short activities during sessions. Although he's still in training ("on his L plates"), he's already making a positive impact.

This financial year, we provided nearly 5,000 counselling appointments to over 655 clients, ranging in age from 3 to 89 and hailing from 37 different countries. Our counselling service is truly remarkable, and we extend our heartfelt gratitude to all of our psychologists and counsellors. Your dedication to Wavecare's clients over the past year has been outstanding.

Chair Report

“It is pleasing to report that Wavecare has again kept its head above water financially during the 2023-2024 period.”

Wavecare has been supporting the most vulnerable members of the Monash community since 1978, and this need, without doubt, is greater today than ever before.

Mental health is regularly in the headlines these days, and the recent Parliamentary hearing into social media has highlighted the alarming link between social media use and teenage mental health.

This follows the Lancet Psychiatry Commission on youth mental health report released in August 2024 that shows two in five young Australians suffer a serious mental health problem each year, a figure that has increased by 50% since 2007. Despite the increase, experts say Australia is spending only about a third of what it needs to address what is the main health burden for people aged 10 to 24 years.

Professor Patrick McGorry, executive director of Orygen, Australia’s Centre of excellence in Youth Mental Health said the Lancet report was the culmination of four years’ work and signified a major step in recognising youth mental health as a global health priority.

He said in Australia, mental health was neglected generally but young people were the most needy among the mentally ill.

Wavecare counsellors and staff have once again done an outstanding job and certainly deserve our sincere thanks and gratitude.

I want to particularly recognise and thank Wavecare CEO Michelle Gilmore for her excellent leadership, dedication and commitment. Wavecare is indeed fortunate to have Michelle at the helm.

The Board has worked together harmoniously and collaboratively, and I thank each one of them for their support and valued contribution throughout

the year. Wavecare Board members offer their time and services voluntarily.

It is pleasing to report that Wavecare has again kept its head above water financially during the 2023-2024 period, and was able to finish the year with an operating surplus.

We would like to do more at Wavecare, however this is dependent upon additional sources of stable funding being realised. This remains an ongoing challenge for the Board and the organisation.

Wavecare would be a much less effective community organisation without the support of many generous and caring organisations, volunteers and other people. We extend our grateful thanks to all those concerned.

In particular, I want to acknowledge the ongoing Community Grants Programme funding we receive from the Monash City Council, and thank Councilors, staff, Director of Community Services Russell Hopkins, and CEO Dr Andi Diamond for their strong support.

Gabriel Tsang, one of our Glencare participants passed away this year. Gabriel attended Glencare on Fridays with his wife and had a pleasant time with the group.

In collaboration with Monash University, Wavecare has had the opportunity to take on Masters of Social Work placement

students. These students have played several roles at Wavecare and also engaged with the Glencare program. The participants have enjoyed interacting and learning from the students and have also taken part in some of the activities organised by them.

Over the years, Glencare has had a tremendous group of volunteers who have supported the participants, staff and myself. Their invaluable contribution to the program requires significant acknowledgement and appreciation. A very big thank you to Joop, Ian, Anjula, Wendy, Freida, Kyle, George and Swarna.

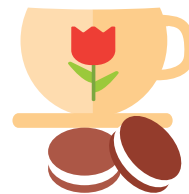

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2024

NOTE 1 – SUMMARY OF MATERIAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Financial Reporting Framework

The financial statements are special-purpose financial statements prepared to meet the requirements of the Australian Charities and Not-For-Profits Commission Regulations 2013. The Entity is a not-for-profit for financial reporting requirements under Australian Accounting Standards.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the mandatory Australian Accounting Standards applicable to entities reporting under the Australian Charities and Not-For-Profits-Commission Regulation 2013, the basis of accounting specified by all Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of Accounting Standards AASB101: Presentation of Financial Statements, AASB 107: Cash Flow Statements, AASB 108: Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors, AASB 124: Related Party Disclosures, AASB 1031: Materiality, AASB 1048: Interpretation Standards and AASB 1054: Australian Additional Disclosures.

(b) Basis of preparation

The financial statements, except for the cash flow information, have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs unless otherwise stated in the notes.

(c) Material accounting policies

The entity has no material accounting policies that are required to be disclosed in the financial statements.

Accounting policies are consistent with prior year reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

NOTE 2: RENT IN KIND

City of Monash support to Wavecare includes provision of operational and office space valued at \$7,178 p.a. for Glencare and \$20,000 p.a. for general administration and counselling space. This has been included as grant income and expensed as Glencare & Administration expenditure.

Independent Auditor's Review Report to Wavecare Inc

Report on the Financial Report

We have reviewed the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report of Wavecare Inc, which comprises the statement of assets and liabilities as at 30 June 2024, the statement of cash flows for the year ended on that date, notes comprising a summary of material accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the statement by directors.

Directors' Responsibility for the Financial Report

The directors of the registered entity are responsible for the preparation of the financial report that gives a true and fair view and have determined that the basis of preparation described in Note 1 to the financial report is appropriate to meet the requirements of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012* (ACNC Act) and the needs of the members. The trustees' responsibility also includes such internal control that the trustees determine is necessary to enable the preparation of a financial report that gives a true and fair view and is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on the financial report based on our review. We conducted our review in accordance with Auditing Standard on Review Engagements ASRE 2400 *Review of a Financial Report Performed by an Assurance Practitioner Who is Not the Auditor of the Entity*, in order to state whether, on the basis of the procedures described, we have become aware of any matter that makes us believe that the financial report does not satisfy the requirements of Division 60 of the ACNC Act including: giving a true and fair view of the registered entity's financial position as at 30 June 2024 and its performance for the year ended on that date; and complying with the Australian Accounting Standards and the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Regulations 2022* (ACNC Regulations). ASRE 2415 requires that we comply with the ethical requirements relevant to the review of the financial report.

A review of a financial report consists of making enquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Independence

In conducting our review, we have complied with the independence requirement of the ACNC Act. We confirm that the independence declaration required by the ACNC Act, has been given to the Directors.
